### **Work Style**

- Bring energy, enthusiasm, and a spirit of cooperation
- Present a positive image of the organization
- Offer action, excitement, and fun
- Link people, information, and resources
- Accept and deal with others as they are, even treating them generously

### Leadership Style

- · Lead by promoting goodwill and teamwork
- Prefer managing initial steps of a project
- Defuse tense situations by putting people at ease
- Make things happen by focusing on immediate problems
- Facilitate effective interactions among people

#### **Potential Pitfalls**

- May overemphasize subjective data in an effort to maintain harmony
- · May jump into things without first reflecting on what is at hand
- May spend too much time socializing and neglect tasks
- May not always finish what they start
